Fighting to give residents a real say

ib Dem councillors recently forced a challenge to Fareham's Draft Local Plan, which calls for hundreds of new homes on greenfield sites - including 475 alongside the re-routed Newgate Lane at Peel Common.

We said residents should be offered more options in the public consultation on the plan. We argued that the sites it proposed to allocate were unbalanced across the borough.

The Lib Dems called for more information about funding for infrastructure, and we pointed out that the wording of the draft plan gave the

impression that the Council was giving permission for some sites, rather than just recommending them at this stage.

The Tory majority on the Council's but they admitted that we made several ++ stop press ++ st make it clear that residents could have a real say in the Consultation.

Jim Forrest attended both of the Council committees considering the Draft Plan - the only candidate in this election to do so.

IFA2: National Grid replies

ational Grid has published a Number of new reports about IFA2, the proposed electricity interconnector proposed at Daedalus.

They set out responses to many of the questions raised about the project by residents, councillors and users of the airfield. We strongly urge everyone to read them

The reports can be found via the IFA2 links on Fareham Council's website www.fareham.gov.uk (Scroll down to "Latest News - 25th September 2017.")

The reports which may be of most interest to residents are those on Noise, Radio and Telecoms Interference, and TV reception.

They're written in densely technical language, but National Grid asserts it will meet the conditions laid down by the Council on: Public safety from

electro-magnetic fields; Noise; and TV/Radio reception.

The report on Telecoms Interference seems to leave more questions open, and we'd want to see assurances that users of the airfield are satisfied that their equipment is safe.

* PLANS have also been published for the public open space to be created round the site if IFA2 goes ahead.

This would give a landscaped green corridor along Gosport Road from just east of Southways to Peel Common and the Alver Valley.

It would give Stubbington residents much more of a share in the Daedalus land than anything previously proposed.

Worth considering - so long as we can be assured of safe operation of the converter and its cabling.


